"Let us commend ourselves and one another and our whole life to Christ our God"

Dear beloved parishioners, Happy and Blessed New Year!

As we are entering the new year 2025, we are grateful to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ for all His precious gifts, "for all things we know and do not know, for blessings manifest and hidden that have been bestowed on us" and for the great gift of time. Time is given to us to manage our lives, but it really belongs to God. The only thing that is ours to do is to use time wisely, respectfully, in His service, and with one

intention: to draw closer to God and save our souls. At the same time, the changing of a calendar year gives us the opportunity or responsibility to look back, consider our wrongdoings and failures, correct things, plan the future and become better humans for God, for our families and for our society. This is called personal accountability as Orthodox Christians and citizens of this earth.

In our days, we know that the biggest problem the people of this world have is **stress** that often leads to **distress**. Stress is a human reaction to either physical or emotional challenges in life. A great feeling of tension is created that keeps us from functioning normally and reasonably and can contribute to health problems and various psychological disorders, including anxiety and depression. Undoubtedly, the people who are further away from Christ and His Church are more susceptible to being stressed, sometimes uncontrollably. And unfortunately, some of us forget to turn to God for help when we need Him the most.

Jesus Christ assured us: "Your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you. So do not worry about tomorrow; for tomorrow will care for itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own" (Matthew 6:32-34). He knows who we are and what we need, much better than we do. Rather, He wants us to seek Him first and His Kingdom and He will take care of everything else. He wants us to visit Him at His house which is the Church, participate in the Holy Sacraments, receive His Most Immaculate Body and Blood frequently, prepare ourselves by repenting and confessing our sins, serving others and trusting Him and His will. This is exactly what we repeat and offer as a prayer at every Divine Liturgy when we sing: "Commemorating our most holy, pure, blessed, and glorious Lady, the Theotokos and ever-virgin Mary, with all the saints, let us commend ourselves and one another and our whole life to Christ our God". We affirm that our whole life belongs to God, and we entrust our lives to Him.

My dear parishioners,

Another year will be unfolding before us. Another great opportunity to start fresh and anew. Another chance to make things right. Another occasion to glorify God for everything He has given to us and to pledge ourselves completely to Him. It is vital and essential to realize that God must be our priority in life. That we are His and the more we trust Him the more He will take care of us. Our only stress must be how to find the right path that will bring us into the Kingdom of God. And this right path will be found only through the Orthodox Church and our full participation in the spiritual life of our Church.

The year 2024 was a very important one for our Greek Orthodox Cathedral Community and a milestone in our history, as we celebrated our 90th Anniversary. This year-long celebration united our parish and gave us many reasons to feel proud and blessed for everything we have received from our ancestors but also consider our many responsibilities for the future of our parish. I am grateful to Holy Trinity for all of you and I am very proud of our youth. Our children are exceptional, and they guarantee the continuation of our parish's legacy and history into a brighter future!

Happy New Year Holy Trinity Cathedral family! May the Blessing and Grace of God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit be with you all!

«Εαυτούς και αλλήλους και πάσαν την ζωήν ημών Χριστώ τω Θεώ παραθώμεθα»

Αγαπητοί μου Ενορίτες,

Σε κάθε Θεία Λειτουργία και Ιερή Ακολουθία της Εκκλησίας μας προσευχόμαστε στον Θεό και του δίνουμε μια υπόσχεση: ότι θα εμπιστευθούμε απόλυτα τους εαυτούς μας και ολόκληρη τη ζωή μας στον Χριστό. Αυτή την προσευχή την λέμε και την επαναλαμβάνουμε συνεχώς, αλλά τις περισσότερες φορές δεν καταλαβαίνουμε τι λέμε. Αν πράγματι πιστεύαμε ότι ολόκληρος ο εαυτός μας ανήκει στον Θεό και το θέλημά Του, τότε σίγουρα θα ήμασταν διαφορετικοί σαν άνθρωποι και Χριστιανοί.

Καθώς εισερχόμαστε στο νέο έτος 2025, καλούμαστε και πάλι να αναλογιστούμε τις ευθύνες μας και να διορθώσουμε τα λάθη του παρελθόντος. Παράλληλα, οφείλουμε να ευχαριστήσουμε τον Πανάγαθο Θεό για όλα όσα μας έχει χαρίσει, για ευεργεσίες που γνωρίζουμε αλλά και γιαυτές που δεν γνωρίζουμε, για την υγεία μας, για την οικογένειά μας, για τις επιτυχίες μας, ακόμα και για τις αποτυχίες μας και τις δοκιμασίες μας.

Όπως πολύ καλά γνωρίζουμε, η σημερινή κοινωνία και οι περισσότεροι άνθρωποι πάσχουν από την σύγχρονη ασθένεια που ονομάζεται «άγχος». Το άγχος προκαλείται μεν από πολλούς παράγοντες, αλλά αν το δούμε από πνευματική οπτική γωνιά, όταν έχουμε άγχος (σε ακραία βέβαια όρια) σημαίνει ότι δεν πιστεύουμε σωστά στον Θεό. Όπως έλεγε και ο Άγιος Παΐσιος: «Το άγχος είναι του διαβόλου. Όταν βλέπετε άγχος, να ξέρετε ότι εκεί έχει βάλει την ουρά του το ταγκαλάκι (ο διάβολος). Όταν νιώθουμε στον αγώνα μας άγχος, να ξέρουμε ότι δεν κινούμαστε στον χώρο του Θεού. Ο Θεός δεν είναι τύρρανος να μας πνίγη. [...] Ο Χριστός όλο αγάπη, καλωσύνη και παρηγοριά είναι και ποτέ δεν πνίγει, αλλά έχει άφθονο πνευματικό οξυγόνο, θεία παρηγοριά».

Ο Χριστός μας διδάσκει και μας παρακαλεί να τον τοποθετήσουμε στο κέντρο της ζωής μας, στο κέντρο της οικογενείας μας, στο κέντρο των αποφάσεών μας. Χωρίς Χριστό, η ζωή μας είναι γεμάτη άγχος και αγωνία. Όταν όμως έχουμε τον Χριστό, τότε θα μπορέσουμε να αντιμετωπίσουμε τα πάντα, με μεγαλύτερη ευκολία και υπομονή. Ο Χριστός δεν μας υπόσχεται ότι θα μας βοηθήσει με μαγικό τρόπο, αλλά ότι θα μας βοηθήσει να τα καταφέρουμε, και να ξεπεράσουμε οποιοδήποτε και αν είναι το πρόβλημα. Αρκεί να ακουμπήσουμε τα προβλήματά μας, το άγχος μας, τις αγωνίες μας, το μέλλον των παιδιών μας, το άυριο ολόκληρο στα πόδια του Θεού και να Του έχουμε επιστοσύνη. Όπως μας διαβεβαιώνει στο Ευαγγέλιο «αν ζητείτε εμένα και την Βασιλεία μου, τότε θα σας δώσω όλα όσα χρειάζετε!» (Ματθ. 6, 33).

Αγαπητοί μου αδελφοί και Ενορίτες,

Καθώς ξεκινούμε τη νέα χρονιά, και όλοι έχουμε όνειρα, ελπίδες και προσδοκίες, ας υποσχεθούμε στον Θεό ότι θα Τον βάλουμε στην ζωή μας ως προτεραιότητα. «Πρώτα ο Θεός!» να λέμε συνέχεια. Να καταλάβουμε ότι ζωή μας είναι στα χέρια Του. Να ερχόμαστε τακτικά στην Εκκλησία, να μεταλαμβάνουμε το Τίμιο και Πανάγιο Σώμα και Αίμα Του, και να γεμίσουμε την ζωή μας και το σπίτι μας με Χριστό. Να διδάξουμε στα παιδιά μας, που δυστυχώς ζούν σε μία κοινωνία εχθρική ως προς την πίστη στον Θεό, ότι μόνο με την βοήθεια και την Χάρη Του μπορούν να πετύχουν στη ζωή τους. Και εμείς να γίνουμε παράδειγμα πίστης και εμπιστοσύνης στον Θεό για τα παιδιά μας.

Μέσα από την καρδιά μου εύχομαι και προσεύχομαι να είστε όλοι καλά και να εορτάσετε με υγεία και χαρά τις Άγιες Εορτές αλλά και κάθε ημέρα του Θεού. 
A MESSAGE FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL PRESIDENT

Y.A.L. News (Young Adult League)



THE THEOPHANY OF OUR LORD AND SAVIOUR JESUS CHRIST (January 6)

Apolytikion in the First Tone

Lord, when You were baptized in the Jordan, the veneration of the Trinity was revealed. For the voice of the Father gave witness to You, calling You Beloved, and the Spirit, in the guise of a dove, confirmed the certainty of His words. Glory to You, Christ our God, who appeared and enlightened the world.

Kontakion in the Fourth Tone

You appeared to the world today, and Your light, O Lord, has left its mark upon us. With fuller understanding we sing to You: "You came, You were made manifest, the unapproachable light."

Reading:

About the beginning of our Lord's thirtieth year, John the Forerunner, who was some six months older than Our Saviour according to the flesh, and had lived in the wilderness since his childhood, received a command from God and came into the parts of the Jordan, preaching the baptism of repentance unto the remission of sins. Then our Saviour also came from Galilee to the Jordan, and sought and received baptism though He was the Master and John was but a servant. Whereupon, there came to pass those marvellous deeds, great and beyond nature: the Heavens were opened, the Spirit descended in the form of a dove upon Him that was being baptized and the voice was heard from the Heavens hearing witness that this was the beloved Son of God, now baptized as a man (Matt. 3:13-17; Mark 1:9-11; Luke 3:1-22). From these events the Divinity of the Lord Jesus Christ and the great mystery of the Trinity were demonstrated. It is also from this that the present feast is called "Theophany," that is, the divine manifestation, God's appearance among men. On this venerable day the sacred mystery of Christian baptism was inaugurated; henceforth also began the saving preaching of the Kingdom of the Heavens.



SYNAXIS OF JOHN THE HOLY GLORIOUS PROPHET, BAPTIST, & FORERUNNER (January 7) Apolytikion in the Second Tone

The memory of the just is celebrated with hymns of praise, but the Lord's testimony is sufficient for thee, O Forerunner; for thou hast proved to be truly even more venerable than the Prophets, since thou was granted to baptize in the running waters Him Whom they proclaimed. Wherefore, having contested for the truth, thou didst rejoice to announce the good tidings even to those in Hades: that God hath appeared in the flesh, taking away the sin of the world and granting us great mercy.

Kontakion in the Plagal of the Second Tone

The Jordan accepted Your presence in the flesh and reversed its course in fear. John, fulfilling the spiritual ministry, fell back in awe. The ranks of Angels, seeing You in the flesh, baptized in the river, were amazed, and all who were in darkness were filled with light, praising You who appeared and enlightened all.

Reading:

Today we celebrate the Synaxis in honour of the most sacred Forerunner, since he ministered at the Mystery of the Divine Baptism of our Lord Jesus Christ. Rest from labour. Fish allowed

Holy Water, which is imbued with the Divine Energies of God through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, is used to bless every aspect of our lives. By blessing we sanctify, beautify, and dedicate all things for the good and the beautiful. We receive a special blessing from God, which enables us to see all of creation in a redeemed way, and discover that all things can be used for the purpose of union with God..



SYNAXIS OF THE THREE HIERARCHS: BASIL THE GREAT, GREGORY THE THEOLOGIAN, & JOHN CHRYSOSTOM Apolytikion in the First Tone

The three most great luminaries of the Three-Sun Divinity have illumined all of the world with the rays of doctrines divine and true; they are the sweetly-flowing rivers of wisdom, who with godly knowledge have watered all creation in clear and mighty streams: The great and sacred Basil, and the Theologian, wise Gregory, together with the renowned John, the famed Chrysostom of golden speech. Let us all who love their divinely-wise words come together, honouring them with hymns; for ceaselessly they offer entreaty for us to the Trinity.

Kontakion in the Second Tone

Receive, O Lord, the Sacred Heralds who preached God, the pinnacle of Teachers, unto the enjoyment of Your riches and rest. You have received their labors and their suffering as being above and beyond all fruitful offering. For You alone glorify Your Saints.

Reading:

This common feast of these three teachers was instituted a little before the year 1100, during the reign of the Emperor Alexis I Comnenus, because of a dispute and strife that arose among the notable and virtuous men of that time. Some of them preferred Basil, while others preferred Gregory, and yet others preferred John Chrysostom, quarreling among themselves over which of the three was the greatest. Furthermore, each party, in order to distinguish itself from the others, assumed the name of its preferred Saint; hence, they called themselves Basilians, Gregorians, or Johannites. Desiring to bring an end to the contention, the three Saints appeared together to the saintly John Mavropous, a monk who had been ordained Bishop of Euchaita, a city of Asia Minor, they revealed to him that the glory they have at the throne of God is equal, and told him to compose a common service for the three of them, which he did with great skill and beauty. Saint John of Euchaita (celebrated Oct. 5) is also the composer of the Canon to the Guardian Angel, the Protector of a Man's Life. In his old age, he retired from his episcopal see and again took up the monastic life in a monastery in Constantinople. He reposed during the reign of the aforementioned Emperor Alexis Comnenus (1081-1118).





Έθιμα: Τα Κάλαντα των Χριστουγέννων

Δρ. Κώστας Γ. Φούντζουλας

Η λέξη Κάλαντα προέργεται από την Λατινική Calendae (Καλένδαι), που σημαίνει λέξη "Πρωτομηνιές." Ανατολική Ρωμαϊκή Στην Αυτοκρατορία, Βυζαντινή γνωστή και ως συνήθιζαν να εορτάζουν Αυτοκρατορία, Καλένδες του Ιανουαρίου με ιδιαίτερη λαμπρότητα, οι οποίες, σε μεγάλο βαθμό, εσχετίζοντο με αρχαιοελληνικά έθιμα. Οι "Καλένδαι" Ιανουαρίου ωνομάζονταν Πυανέψια, ονομασία προερχομένη από τον μήνα Πυανεψώνα Οκτωβρίου με 15 Νοεμβρίου). Στήν αρχαία Ελλάδα, κατά τη διάρκεια των Διονυσιακών εορτών, τα παιδιά επισκέπτονταν τα σπίτια, κρατώντας στό χέρι ένα κλαδί δάφνης ή ελιάς, τυλιγμένο με πρόβειο μαλλί, την "Ερεσιώνη", και τραγουδούσαν τα κάλαντα. Τα παιδιά τότε, όπως και σήμερα πήγαιναν στα σπίτια και έλεγαν διάφορα άσματα για να πάρουν φιλοδώρημα.

Τα Χριστουγεννιάτικα κάλαντα στην πραγματικότητα είναι Πρωτοχρονιάτικα γιατί μέχρι τον 4ο αιώνα Μ.Χ. η 25η του Δεκεμβρίου εορτάζονταν ως αρχή του νέου έτους. Κατά μιά παράδοση, η συνήθεια να ψάλλονται τα κάλαντα των Χριστουγέννων διεσώθηκε από τον Άγιο Φραγκίσκο. Μάλιστα λένε, πώς όταν οι χωρικοί τον επισκεύθηκαν στην Χριστουγεννιάτικη σκηνή του αυτός τους εζήτησε να τραγουδήσουν τα κάλαντα.

Παλαιότερα τα παιδιά έψαλλαν τα κάλαντα το βράδυ της παραμονής των Χριστουγέννων, της Πρωτοχρονιάς και των Φώτων, κρατώντας μία μαγκούρα ή ένα ραβδί για να προστατευθούν από τα άγρια σκυλιά. Τα τελευταία χρόνια τα παιδιά ψάλλουν τα κάλλαντα το πρωί της παραμονής των τριών μεγάλων αυτών εορτών, ξεκινώντας συνήθως από τις 5 η ώρα το πρωί. Ενώ παλαιότερα τα παιδιά κρατούσαν ένα καραβάκι όταν έψαλαν τα κάλαντα, τώρα κρατούν ένα χαλύβδινο τρίγωνο, που κτυπούν ρυθμικά καθ' όσον ψάλλουν τα κάλαντα για να κρατούν τον ρυθμό. Κατά την αρχαία εορτή των "Ανθεστηρίων" ο ερχομός του Διονύσου παρίστατο επίσης με ένα ομοίωμα καραβιού. Τα παλιά τα χρόνια, με την μεγάλη φτώχεια, μιας και τα χρήματα ήταν σπάνια, το πιο συνηθισμένο φιλοδώρημα των παιδιών ήταν τα "Κόλιντρα"; δηλαδή μικρές κουλούρες από σιτάρι ή κριθάρι. Τα έθιμά μας πηγαίνουν πολλούς αιώνες πίσω!

Customs: Kalanda or Christmas Carols*

The word "Kalanda" is derived from the Latin word "Calendae", meaning "The first day of the month." In the Eastern Roman Empire, also known as Byzantine Empire, they used to observe the Calendae of January in a particular magnificent way that, to a great extend, were related to ancient Hellenic customs. The "Calendae" of January were called "Pianepsia", name derived from the month "Pianepsiona" (15 October to 15 November). In ancient Greece, during the Dionysian festivities, the kids were visiting the houses and they were singing the calanda holding in their hand a laurel or an olive branch, wrapped up in sheep wool, which was called "Eresioni." The kids then, as now, were singing various songs (caroling) at the houses for a tip.

However, the Christmas Kalanda were New Year's Kalanda, because until the 4th century A.D. the 25th of December was considered the beginning of the New Year. According to a legend, the custom of singing the Kalanda (Caroling) of Christmas was preserved by Saint Francis. In particular, it is said that when some peasants visited his tent during Christmas he asked them to carol.

In the past, the kids used to carol during the evening of the Christmas Eve, New Year 's Day and Epiphany (Phota), holding a cane or a stick in order to protect themselves from the wild dogs of the neighborhood. Nowadays, the kids sing the Kalanda during the morning of the eve of these three great feasts of Christianity, by visiting the houses as early as 5:00 o'clock in the morning. Whereas in the past the kids were holding a small effigy of a ship when they were caroling, now they usually are holding a small steel triangle, which they are beating rhythmically inasmuch as singing carols to keep the During the ancient Greek "Anthestiria" (Flower Festival), the arrival of god Dionysos was also portrayed by an effigy of a small ship. In the not so distant past, at the times of the great poverty, since money was scarce, the most common tip of the children were "Kolintra", that is small spiral loaves of wheat or barley. Our customs go back many eons!

* Carol: Derived from the Latin choraules, which is derived from the Greek choraules, "a flute player who accompanied the choral dance."
