Dear beloved parishioners of Holy Trinity,

April is here! Spring has sprung! After the cold and dormancy of winter, we are already experiencing warmer temperatures, blooming flowers and longer daylight hours. Nature is waking up after winter and the season of new beginnings and renewal has begun! In that sense, the coming of Pascha, Christ's Resurrection, marks the victory and triumph of life over death and sin, which is the quintessence and core of our Orthodox Faith.

In the Nicene Creed, our Symbol of Faith, we proclaim: "And He rose on the third day, according to the Scriptures. ... I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the age to come. Amen." The Christ's Resurrection is the cornerstone of our Faith, as it demonstrates that Christ's sacrifice on the Cross has overcome death and offers eternal life to those who believe in him. It signifies that Christ conquered death through his death and resurrection, offering humanity a path to eternal life. This "eternal life"



promised by our Savior, will become a reality when all the dead shall arise and come to meet Jesus, as St. Paul affirms: "For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have fallen asleep" (1 Thessalonians 4:14). Jesus Christ's Resurrection constitutes the first fruits of the resurrection for all humanity. This is exactly what St. Paul means in the aforementioned verse. And this is exactly what we celebrate on Easter: the opening of Paradise closed, as St. John of Damascus writes: "Your death, O Lord, became the agent of immortality; for if you had not been laid in the tomb, Paradise would not have been opened".

I am using all these scriptural and theological references, not to bore you, but to clarify and demonstrate once again the verity and beauty of our Orthodox Faith, which constantly reminds us that we are the Church of the Resurrection! Unfortunately, most of us, being absorbed and disoriented by the matters and trials of this worldly life, often miss the point and essence of our faith. We may come to Church often and "fulfill" our "religious obligations" properly, but we do things in a very mechanical fashion, outwardly, letting the true meanings and messages of our faith pass by and go to waste. The glorious night of the Resurrection, on Holy Saturday night, our Church will boldly remind us that "Christ is Risen" and we will splendidly proclaim that "Truly He is Risen!". Do we truly and indeed believe that? Do we believe that Jesus Christ rose from the dead and so will we? For, if we do believe that, then everything in our lives must be changed. Fear of death must not overcome us, but only fear of missing salvation. If we see things through the light and prism of Christ's Resurrection and our promised future resurrection, then this life will become sweeter and easier; problems, trials, and difficulties will only become the vessel and way to draw us closer to God, where there is no room for despair and loss of faith and hope.

After a long winter and a 40-day Lent, it is time to enjoy Spring and rejoice in Christ's Resurrection. Jesus Christ is our life. He is everything. He must be our priority. He must become the center of our hearts, choices and decisions. And even though this life is full of tribulations and challenges, we must rely on Christ and commend ourselves to Him. He has conquered death and promised us an eternal life with Him! Is there anything better than this? The Orthodox Church is an absolute blessing in our lives. We ought to glorify and thank God every day for giving us such a divine gift. The Church is the hospital for the spiritually sick, the hotel for the spiritually tired and exhausted, and the home for everyone. Christ assured us of this through His glorious

Resurrection and His promise of our resurrection and eternal life.

As your pastor and spiritual father, I humbly ask that we do not miss this year's Easter. I don't mean only physically but also spiritually. Our Parish will be offering us a wealth of spiritual opportunities and Services to enhance our spiritual life and truly, wholly, and meaningfully live all the magnificent divine events that will be unfolded before us on Holy Week. Please make time to come to Church on Holy Week. This is the time we dedicate to our Lord and a small token of our appreciation to Him for being in our lives. Please fast, cleanse your souls through confession, prepare your souls and bodies for His Passion and Resurrection, love, forgive, forget, support, smile, rejoice, spread kindness and compassion to all. And most importantly, the night of the Resurrection, come to Church and stay for the Divine Liturgy, which is the "most beautiful" Liturgy of the year. That Divine Liturgy follows the exclamation of "Xριστός Ανέστη – Christ is Risen" and fulfills the celebration of Easter and our preparation all through Great Lent. Please stay and partake of the Risen Immaculate Body and Blood of Jesus Christ so that we may sing: "Grant o Lord that we may more distinctly partake of You, on that day that has no evening in Your Kingdom" Amen!

Απρίλιος 2025

Αγαπητοί μου Ενορίτες,

Η Χάρη και η μακροθυμία του Θεού μας αξιώνει και πάλι να φθάσουμε στις πανάγιες ημέρες του Πάσχα, να ζήσουμε από κοντά τα Θεία Πάθη και όλα τα γεγονότα της Μεγάλης Εβδομάδας, και να εορτάσουμε πανηγυρικά και χαρούμενα την Ζωηφόρο και Λαμπροφόρο Ανάσταση του Κυρίου μας. Το κλίμα των αγίων ημερών που ζούμε μέσα στην Εκκλησία, μαζί με την άνοιξη που ήρθε δυναμικά μετά από ένα βαρύ χειμώνα, μας βοηθούν να προετοιμαστούμε καλύτερα πνευματικά, ψυχικά και σωματικά ώστε να καταλάβουμε τα σπουδαία νοήματα της Αναστάσεως. Η αναγέννηση της φύσης, το άνθισμα το λουλουδιών και τα αρώματα που η φύση απλόχερα σκορπάει στον αέρα, μας θυμίζουν το «γλυκύ έαρ» όπως ψάλλουμε στα Εγκώμια, που δεν είναι άλλος από τον Κύριό μας Ιησού Χριστό.

Για εμάς τους Ορθοδόξους Χριστιανούς, το Πάσχα δεν είναι απλά μια «παραδοσιακή τελετή» η οποία περνάει από γενιά σε γενιά. Βέβαια, είναι στο "DNA" μας να αγαπούμε ιδιαίτερα αυτή την εποχή και γιορτή, και μάλιστα να φέρνουμε στο μυαλό μας μνήμες και αναμνήσεις από τα παιδικά μας χρόνια: όταν οι γονείς μας, ο παππούς και η γιαγιά μας πήγαιναν στην Εκκλησία να ακούσουμε τα «12 Ευαγγέλια», να στολίσουμε τον Επιτάφιο και να ξενυχτίσουμε, να πάμε στην «Αποκαθήλωση», στα «Εγκώμια», στην «Πρώτη Ανάσταση» όπου θα κάναμε και πολύ «θόρυβο» χτυπώντας τις καρέκλες και άλλα κατσαρολικά, μετά να πάμε σπίτι και να τσιμπήσουμε κρυφά ένα αυγό ή λίγο τσουρέκι, αν και ήταν ακόμα νηστεία, και τέλος να πάμε το βράδυ στην «Ανάσταση», να ακούσουμε το «Χριστός Ανέστη», να φιληθούμε με τους αγαπημένους μας και μετά να πάμε να φάμε τη «μαγειρίτσα» και να γιορτάσουμε με την οικογένεια, ενώ την άλλη μέρα τη «Λαμπρή» να σουβλίσουμε το αρνί και να γλεντήσουμε (εγώ πρόλαβα τις σούβλες που τις γυρίζαμε με το χέρι...).

Όλα τα παραπάνω είναι πολύ ωραία, μας έχουν σημαδέψει και μας ακολουθούν μια ζωή. Όμως το νόημα της Εορτής δεν είναι να φάμε, να πιούμε και να χορέψουμε. Καλά είναι κι αυτά, αλλά έρχονται ως αποτέλεσμα της συνηδειτοποίησης του αληθινού μηνύματος του Πάσχα, που δεν είναι άλλο από τη νίκη του Χριστού έναντι του Διαβόλου, και της ζωής έναντι του θανάτου. Ο Απόστολος Παύλος μας υπενθυμίζει ότι: «Νυνὶ δὲ Χριστὸς ἐγήγερται ἐκ νεκρῶν, ἀπαρχὴ τῶν κεκοιμημένων. ἐπειδὴ γὰρ δι' ἀνθρώπου θάνατος, καὶ δι' ἀνθρώπου ὰνάστασις νεκρῶν· ὅσπερ γὰρ ἐν τῷ Ἀδὰμ πάντες ἀποθνήσκουσιν, οὕτως καὶ ἐν τῷ Χριστῷ πάντες ζφοποιηθήσονται.» (Α' Κορινθ. 15:20-22) δηλαδή: ο Χριστός όντως έχει αναστηθεί εκ των νεκρών. Αναστήθηκε πρώτος από όλους και έγινε η αρχή της αναστάσεως όλων των κεκοιμημένων. Επειδή ακριβώς δια μέσου ανθρώπου, του Αδάμ, ήλθε ο θάνατος στο γένος των ανθρώπων, έτσι και δια μέσου ενός ανθρώπου, του νέου Αδάμ, του Χριστού, θα έλθει η ανάσταση των νεκρών. Όπως δηλαδή όλοι οι άνθρωποι πεθαίνουν, έτσι και δια μέσου της χάριτος και της ενώσεως με τον Χριστό όλοι θα ζωοποιηθούν. Και αλλού μας λέγει ο ίδιος Απόστολος: «Εὶ γὰρ πιστεύομεν ὅτι Ἰησοῦς ἀπέθανε καὶ ἀνέστη, οὕτω καὶ ὁ Θεὸς τοὺς κοιμηθέντας διὰ τοῦ Ἰησοῦ ἄξει σὺν αὐτῷ.» (Α' Θεσσαλ. 4:14), δηλαδή: εάν πραγματικά και αληθινά πιστεύουμε ότι ο Ιησούς πέθανε και αναστήθηκε, πρέπει να πιστεύουμε ότι ο Θεός θα αναστήσει αυτούς που πέθαναν με πίστη στο Χριστό και θα τους φέρει μαζί Του στην αιώνια ζωή.

Από τα παραπάνω λόγια του Αποστόλου Παύλου, αλλά και από ολόκληρη τη διδασκαλία της Ορθοδόξου Εκκλησίας μας, καταλαβαίνουμε ότι η Ανάσταση του Χριστού έρχεται να κηρύξει και να αναγγείλει τη δική μας ανάσταση. Η Ανάσταση του Χριστού μας υπενθυμίζει ότι ο θάνατος είναι πρόσκαιρος. Όπως θα πούμε το βράδυ της Αναστάσεως στη Θεία Λειτουργία: ο Άδης πικράθηκε γιατί συνειδητοποίησε ότι δεν είχε πλέον δύναμη ώστε να κρατήσει τους νεκρούς φυλακισμένους. Επομένως, ο ανθρώπινος θάνατος από μόνιμη κατάσταση έγινε πρόσκαιρη. Με λαχτάρα και ελπίδα περιμένουμε την Δευτέρα Παρουσία του Κυρίου μας, την ανάσταση του ανθρωπίνου γένους και την αιώνια ζωή κοντά στον Χριστό και τους αγαπημένους μας, όπως ομολογούμε στο Σύμβολο της Πίστεως: «Καὶ πάλιν ἐρχόμενον μετὰ δόξης κρῖναι ζῶντας καὶ νεκρούς, οὖ τῆς βασιλείας οὐκ ἔσται τέλος.... Προσδοκῶ ἀνάστασιν νεκρῶν. Καὶ ζωὴν τοῦ μέλλοντος αἰῶνος. Ἀμήν.»

Η Ανάσταση του Χριστού έχει και άλλο ένα σπουδαίο νόημα: μας υπενθυμίζει ότι υπάρχει πάντα ελπίδα στη ζωή μας. Κάθε άνθρωπος βασανίζεται και δοκιμάζεται σ' αυτή τη ζωή. Πίκρες, θλίψεις, δοκιμασίες, πόνος, αρρώστιες, αποτυχίες, απελπισία, απογοήτευση...πολλές φορές νιώθουμε να σηκώνουμε τον δικό μας σταυρό και να ανεβαίνουμε τον δικό μας Γολγοθά. Τότε ακριβώς πρέπει να θυμόμαστε ότι και ο Χριστός μας πέρασε τα ίδια, ταπεινώθηκε, υπέφερε, βασανίστηκε, σταυρώθηκε και πέθανε. Αλλά δεν τελείωσε εκεί η ιστορία. Την τρίτη ημέρα Αναστήθηκε από τους νεκρούς. Γι'αυτό αδελφοί μου, να μην λυγίζουμε, να μην το βάζουμε κάτω. Με παράδειγμα τον Χριστό μας, με μετάνοια, προσευχή και συμμετοχή στα Μυστήρια της Εκκλησίας μας, να στεκόμαστε στα πόδια μας και να έχουμε ελπίδα και πίστη ότι μετά τον Σταυρό έρχεται η Ανάσταση! Αγαπητοί μου,


Η πίστη μας είναι βιωματική. Πίστη σημαίνει εμπειρία. Μόνο μέσα στην Εκκλησία γευόμαστε και βιώνουμε πραγματικά όλα τα νοήματα της πίστης μας. «Γεύσασθε καί ἴδετε ὅτι χρηστός ὁ Κύριος» ψάλλουμε πριν κοινωνήσουμε στην Θεία Λειτουργία των Προηγιασμένων Δώρων. Ελάτε λοιπόν να γευτείτε και να δείτε με τα μάτια σας την γλύκα και την ομορφιά που μας μεταδίδει ο Χριστός μέσα στην Εκκλησία. Έρχεται η Μεγάλη Εβδομάδα. Τι θα κάνουμε; Πως θα την περάσουμε; Θα την ζήσουμε; Και που και πως θα την ζήσουμε; Όλα αυτά τα ερωτήματα έχουν μία απάντηση: μόνο μέσα στην Εκκλησία! Είμαστε τόσο ευλογημένοι από τον Θεό που έχουμε τη δυνατότητα να πάμε στην Εκκλησία και να γίνουμε αυτόπτες μάρτυρες του μεγαλείου της αγάπης του Θεού. Αυτό είναι η Μεγάλη Εβδομάδα, το μεγαλείο της αγάπης του Θεού στον άνθρωπο.

Σας παρακαλώ, κάντε λίγο χώρο στην πολυάσχολη ζωή σας για τον Χριστό. Βρείτε λίγο χρόνο να τον αφιερώσετε σε Εκείνον. Ελάτε στις Ακολουθίες και Λειτουργίες της Μεγάλης Εβδομάδας, και μαζί με την καθαριότητα του σπιτιού μας, ας καθαρίσουμε και τις ψυχές μας. Και το βράδυ του Μεγάλου Σαββάτου, μετά το «Χριστός Ανέστη» που θα ψάλλουμε τα μεσάνυχτα, ας παραμείνουμε στην Εκκλησία, να ακούσουμε την Θεία Λειτουργία της Αναστάσεως και να κοινωνήσουμε το Αναστημένο Σώμα και Αίμα του Κυρίου μας Ιησού Χριστού. Υπάρχει τίποτα καλύτερο απ' αυτό;

Καλή Ανάσταση! Εύχομαι σε σας και τις οικογένειές σας υγεία, ψυχική και σωματική, και την αληθινή χαρά της Αναστάσεως!





A message from the Parish Council President


Dear Parishioners,














LAZARUS SATURDAY Apolytikion in the First Tone

O Christ our God, before Your Passion, You raised Lazarus from the dead to confirm the common Resurrection for all. Therefore, we carry the symbols of victory as did the youths, and we cry out to You, the victor over death, "Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord."

Kontakion in the Second Tone

Christ, everyone's joy, the truth, the light, life, the resurrection of the world, has by His goodness appeared to those on earth. He is the archetype of the resurrection, granting divine forgiveness to all.

Reading:

Lazarus and his sisters Martha and Mary, the friends of the Lord Jesus, had given Him hospitality and served Him many times (Luke 10:38-4z; John 12:2-3). They were from Bethany, a village of Judea. This village is situated in the eastern parts by the foothills of the Mount of Olives, about two Roman miles from Jerusalem. When Lazarus - whose name is a Hellenized form of "Eleazar," which means "God has helped," became ill some days before the saving Passion, his sisters had this report taken to our Saviour,

Who was then in Galilee. Nonetheless, He tarried yet two more days until Lazarus died; then He said to His disciples, "Let us go into Judea that I might awake My friend who sleepeth." By this, of course, He meant the deep sleep of death. On arriving at Bethany, He consoled the sisters of Lazarus, who was already four days dead. Jesus groaned in spirit and was troubled at the death of His beloved friend. He asked, "Where have ye laid his body?" and He wept over him. When He drew night to the tomb, He commanded that they remove the stone, and He lifted up His eyes, and giving thanks to God the Father, He cried out with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come forth." And he that had been dead four days came forth immediately, bound hand and foot with the grave clothes, and Jesus said to those standing there, "Loose him, and let him go." This is the supernatural wonder wrought by the Saviour that we celebrate on this day.

According to an ancient tradition, it is said that Lazarus was thirty years old when the Lord raised him; then he lived another thirty years on Cyprus and there reposed in the Lord. It is furthermore related that after he was raised from the dead, he never laughed till the end of his life, but that once only, when he saw someone stealing a clay vessel, he smiled and said, "Clay stealing clay." His grave is situated in the city of Kition, having the inscription: "Lazarus the four days dead and friend of Christ." In 890 his sacred relics were transferred to Constantinople by Emperor Leo the Wise, at which time undoubtedly the Emperor composed his stichera for Vespers, "Wishing to behold the tomb of Lazarus..."



Great and Holy Pascha Reading:

Mary Magdalene, and the other women who were present at the burial of our Saviour on Friday evening, returned from Golgotha to the city and prepared fragrant spices and myrrh, so that they might anoint the body of Jesus. On the morrow, because of the law which forbids work on the day of the Sabbath, they rested for the whole day. But at early dawn on the Sunday that followed, almost thirty-six hours since the death of the Life-giving Redeemer, they came to the sepulchre with the spices to anoint His body. While they were considering the difficulty of rolling away the stone from the door of the sepulchre, there was a fearful earthquake; and an Angel, whose countenance shone like lightning and whose garment was white as snow, rolled away the stone and sat upon it. The guards that were there became as dead from fear and took to flight. The women, however, went into the sepulchre, but did not find the Lord's body. Instead, they saw two other Angels in the form of youths clothed in white, who told them that the Saviour was risen, and they sent forth the women, who ran to proclaim to the disciples these gladsome tidings. Then Peter and John arrived, having learned from Mary Magdalene what had come to pass, and

when they entered the tomb, they found only the winding sheets. Therefore, they returned again to the city with joy, as heralds now of the supernatural Resurrection of Christ, Who in truth was seen alive by the disciples on this day on five occasions.

Our Lord, then, was crucified, died, and was buried on Friday, before the setting of the sun, which was the first of His "three days" in the grave; observing the mystical Sabbath, that "seventh day" in which it is said that the Lord "rested from all His works" (Gen. 2:2-3), He passed all of Saturday in the grave; and He arose "while it was yet dark, very early in the morning" on Sunday, the third day, which, according to the Hebrew reckoning, began after sunset on Saturday.

As we celebrate today this joyous Resurrection, we greet and embrace one another in Christ, thereby demonstrating our Saviour's victory over death and corruption, and the destruction of our ancient enmity with God, and His reconciliation toward us, and our inheritance of life everlasting. The feast itself is called Pascha, which is derived from the Hebrew word which means "passover"; because Christ, Who suffered and arose, has made us to pass over from the curse of Adam and slavery to the devil and death unto our primal freedom and blessedness. In addition, this day of this particular week, which is the first of all the rest, is dedicated to the honour of the Lord; in honour and remembrance of the Resurrection, the Apostles transferred to this day the rest from labour that was formerly assigned to the Sabbath of the ancient Law.

Dear beloved Holy Trinity Cathedral family,

We reach out seeking your support for a major maintenance and repair issue. The air conditioning unit for the Community Center is nearly 50 years old. Thanks to diligent monitoring and maintenance, the unit has far exceeded its expected lifespan, but the time has come to replace the unit. The new unit must be in place by June in time for our Festival.

The Parish Council has approved a plan after exploring many alternatives, engaging numerous contractors, and considering various proposals. The new system(s) will include two units on the roof of the Community Center to provide air conditioning for the Hall, only, and 3 smaller units on the roof above the classrooms to provide air conditioning and heat for the classrooms only. The total cost from the accepted proposal including, among other things, the new units and structural support for the roof will be approximately \$250,000.

We humbly request that each family (365 total pledging units in the Parish) consider donating at least \$500 towards this project in addition to your annual pledge. We are aware that some cannot afford this amount, and others can afford much more. Therefore, we ask each family to give what they are able, as any amount is welcome and appreciated. We are counting on your generosity and love to assist us in reaching our \$250,000.00 goal.

The new units have been ordered and are expected to arrive mid-April. Therefore, we kindly ask that you make your loving donation by May 1st, 2025. Διάφορα ΠΑΣΧΑ ή EASTER

Δρ. Κώστας Γ. Φούντζουλας Επαναδημοσίευσις Απρίλιος 2021

Πάσχα και Easter, δύο λέξεις που σημαίνουν το ίδιο πράγμα, την μεγαλύτερη Χριστιανική εορτή, την Ανάσταση του Κυρίου Ημών Ιησού Χριστού. Ας δούμε λοιπόν γιατί στην Ελληνική γλώσσα χρησιμοποιούμε την λέξη Πάσχα, ενώ στα Αγγλικά την λέξη Easter.

Η λέξη Πάσχα προέρχεται από την Αραμαϊκή λέξη pascha, η οποία προέρχεται από την Εβραϊκή λέξη pesakh η οποία σημαίνει πέρασμα, παρέλευση. Η λέξη χρησιμοποιήθηκε από τους Εβραίους σε ανάμνηση της Δεκάτης Πληγής κατά των Αιγυπτίων, όπου σύμφωνα με την βιβλική αφήγηση, ο Άγγελος του Θανάτου προσπερνούσε τις πόρτες των Ιουδαίων της Αιγύπτου που ήταν βαμμένες με αίμα αρνιού (αμνός) και δεν θανάτωνε τα πρωτότοκά τους. Έτσι, οι Έλληνες Χριστιανοί εχρησιμοποίησαν την λέξη Πάσχα για να εκφράσουν το πέρασμα από τον θάνατο στην ζωή (Ανάσταση). Ο Χριστός είναι ο Αμνός του Θεού που μας έσωσε με το αίμα (θυσία) του από την αμαρτία και τον θάνατο.

Η λέξη Easter η οποία χρησιμοποιείται στα Αγγλικά προήλθε από την λέξη Eastre της αρχαίας Αγγλικής πρίν από το 899 Μ.Χ. Η λέξη αναφέρεται στην Γερμανική ειδωλολατρική θεά Eastre η οποία εορτάζοταν κατά την Εαρινή Ισημερία, και η οποία αναγνωρίζεται στην αρχαία Γερμανική λέξη oestaruen -Ostern στα σύγχρονα Γερμανικά. Η λέξη Eastre προέρχεται απο την λέξη oeast η οποία ως γνωστόν σημαίνει ανατολή. Αυτό δείχνει ότι αρχικά αυτή η λέξη αναφερόταν σε θεά σχετική με την αυγή. Σχετικές Ινδοευρωπαϊκές παραδόσεις λαμβάνουν γώρα με την Ρωμαϊκή θεά Αβρόρα και την Ελληνική θεά Ομηρική Ηώς ή Έως που σημαίνει αυγή. Κατ' άλλους όμως σχετίζεται με τις εορτές προς τιμή της Βαβυλονιακής θεάς Ishtar, η Αφροδίτη των Βαβυλωνίων.

Η ημερομηνία εορτασμού του Ορθόδοξου Πάσχα καθωρίσθηκε στην Σύνοδο της Νικαίας το 325 Μ.Χ. Με απόφαση αυτής της Συνόδου το Πάσχα πρέπει να εορτάζεται την Κυριακή μετά την πρώτη πανσέληνο της εαρινής ισημερίας, αλλά πάντοτε μετά το Εβραϊκό Πάσχα, ούτως ώστε να διατηρείται η ακολουθία των γεγονότων της Σταυρώσεως και Αναστάσεως σύμφωνα με τους ευαγγελιστές. Το Ορθόδοξο Πάσχα εορτάζεται από περισσότερα από 250 εκατομμύρια πιστούς σ' όλο τον κόσμο.

Various PASCHA or EASTER

Dr. Costas G. Fountzoulas Republication April 2021

These two words, Pascha and Easter ecclesiastically mean the same thing, the largest Christian celebration, and the Resurrection of our Lord and savior Jesus Christ. Let us see now why in Greek we use the word Pascha, while in English we use the word Easter.

The word Pascha comes from the Aramaic word pascha, which comes from the Hebrew word pesakh, which means passage, skipping, passing over, the well known Passover. This word was used by the Jewish people in commemoration of the night of the Tenth Plague of Pharaoh, when the Angel of Death saw the blood of the passover lamb on the doorposts of the houses of Hebrews of Egypt "skipped over" them and did not kill their firstborn. Therefore, the Christian Hellenes used the word Pascha to express the passing from death the life (Resurrection). Christ is the Lamb of God, who saved us with his sacrifice (blood) from the sin and death.

The modern English term Easter developed from the Old English word Eastre, which itself developed prior to 899. The name refers to the goddess Eastre in Germanic paganism, who was celebrated at the Spring equinox, and has cognates in Old High German oestaruen, plural, Easter (modern German language Ostern). The Old English term Eastre ultimately derives from oeast - meaning the direction of east. This indicates it originally referred to a goddess associated with dawn. Corresponding Indo-European traditions occur with the Roman goddess Aurora and the Greek goddess (Homeric) Eos. However, other people relate the word Easter with the festivities for the goddess Ishtar, which was the Babylonian Aphrodite.

The date of Orthodox Pascha was determined by the Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D. According to the decision of this Synod, Pascha should be celebrated on the Sunday following the first full moon of the vernal equinox, but always after the Jewish Passover, in order to maintain the sequence of events of the Crucifixion and Resurrection according to the evangelists. The Orthodox Pascha is celebrated by more than 250 million followers around the world.



"Should I dare to claim that I was God's instrument to bring freedom to the Sicilians, then I should only be stating the truth." Emperor Michael III Paleologos

It all began when the Greeks retook Constantinople in 1261 under Michael VIII Paleologos. The Pope was outraged, and the Latins were furious to get it back. By 1282, French-born King Charles I of Anjou with the help of the Pope, ruled Southern Italy and was ready to begin the invasion of Constantinople having amassed an army and fleet in Sicily, where he was unpopular due to heavy taxation. The Greek-speaking Romans (Byzantines) of Constantinople, using the proceeds from a mine in Phocaea, north of Smyrna, financed a conspiracy that resulted in the Sicilian Vespers revolt in Palermo. Charles d'Anjou's oppressive occupying force was slaughtered and his fleet of many ships at Messina was burned. Spanish King Peter III of Aragon and his Catalans, also partially funded by the Romans (Byzantines), took over the island instead, on the pretext that his wife Constance was true heir to Sicily, as daughter of its previous ruler Manfred.



General Maintenance

➤ February 2025 -- Walk-In Refrigerator/Walk-In Freezer -- compressors moved outside from the cage inside the northeast stair tower, eliminating interior noise and heat



- ➤ February 2025 **Lightning Protection** installation began on Church building <u>required</u> for insurance coverage
- Spring 2025 repair collapsed drain in north parking lot



> February 2025 - Underground pipe burst/access tunnel collapse - Emergency Repair

- Extensive water leak in Church. Water supply lost to rear north side radiators in church from access tunnel collapse and/or pipe burst. The leak resulted in minimal visible damage but, completely disabled the north side radiators north of the support column and led to a nearly \$1,300 excess water bill. (Similar event occurred a few years ago on south side.)
- Repairs effectuated by installing above ground, external piping to the two (2) large radiators in front half of church along north wall – remaining north side radiators and narthex radiators are now disabled.
- After submitting the repair bills and description of emergent issues that led to the inordinate use of water, the water company reimbursed Church.
- Fortunately, new HVAC unit installed on narthex roof in 2021 provides sufficient heat to compensate for lost radiators at the rear of the church





Spring 2025 - Stairs to Community Center will be repaired when the weather permits



- March 2025 minor Electrical Safety Upgrades/Maintenance
 - close off/upgrade to code old outlets inside Church
 - Replace outlets east wall of Community Center

- Install 4-gang outlet in office behind copier (where line goes through wall)
- · Installation of light switch below scoreboard in Community Center for on/off
- Installation of LED lighting and automatic on/off hallway with new restrooms that leads to Sunday School classrooms
- Installed new timer for (exterior) Community Center Security Lights
- Install 60 amp 3-phase outlet in kitchen

Replacement of HVAC Community Center & Classrooms

Update

- 3 new rooftop units to replace the existing (rooftop) air conditioning units for the classrooms will provide air conditioning and heat to the classrooms
- 2 25-ton units to provide air conditioning and heat to the Community Center that will require some minor reinforcement of the steel girders.
- Demolition of old mechanical room and air handlers in southeast stair tower of Community Center
- Demolition of boiler currently providing heat to the Community and the classrooms and demolition of radiating system (baseboards) in classrooms, balcony bathrooms, and stage.
- · Closure of air return in mechanical room SE tower Community Center
- Achieves replacement of nearly 50-year-old air conditioner for Community
 Center, 20-year-old air conditioners for classrooms, and 25-year-old boiler for
 Community/classrooms, and separates the mechanical systems between the
 Community and Classrooms

Professional consultations HVAC replacement(s):

Existing Units

- ➤ 60-ton air conditioning via split system from 1977. This unit is effectively dead.
- Boiler 1,632,000 BTU from 1999
- Three (3) 3-ton rooftops units providing air conditioning only to classrooms subject to repeated repairs.

Proposal/Bid Process

- > Nine (9) companies were engaged
- Four (4) contractors came to the site, inspected the equipment but were ultimately unable to provide proposals do the complexities posed by the job
- > Two (2) contractors simply never showed up despite repeated requests
- Three (3) companies ultimately performed several inspections and evaluations and provided proposals

- Dozens of visits were made to site in total for various inspections/assessments in preparation of bids. Building Committee members were on site and accompanied contractors for these visits.
- Request was made for additional options regarding a smaller single system for the Hall in light of the reduced load over the years along with a replacement of classroom systems to ensure highest efficiency and heating option.
- > The proposals were reviewed and discussed in detail by the Building Committee
- Options presented for the Community Center included split systems and package systems with various placement options including current location and/or roof top for replacement of the existing units servicing the Hall including the 60-ton cooling system.
- Additional options were presented for replacing and addressing the shortcomings of the separate rooftop systems servicing the classrooms - thereby segregating the classroom systems from the Hall systems for efficiency and easier maintenance/monitoring.
- Cost estimates for the replacement of <u>only</u> the Hall system ranged from (\$125,000.00¹) \$160,000.00-\$275,0000.00 and a separate bid for \$47,000 for new comprehensive heat pump systems for classrooms.
- > The Building Committee has recommended, and the Parish Council has approved the following proposal(s) from Beacon Air:
- Replacing the existing split system with the Installation of 2 25-ton rooftop package system gas/electric heating and cooling unit (\$154,000) for the Community Center w/economizer and specifically remove/replace the existing Trane 60-ton unit
- 2) Price includes demolition and removal of existing system
- 3) Price includes news interior ductwork
- Capping of duct work and boiler lines at existing air handler
- 5) Supply and installation of new gas line from meter to new unit
- Masonry work
- Lift and crane
- 8) Control and wiring
- For classrooms, the installation of (3) Mitsubishi 36MBH Heat Pump Condensers and (3)
 Mitsubishi 36MBH Air Handlers with Backup Heat (\$47,600.00)
- Removal of existing classroom systems
- 11) Crane and trucking
- 12) Duct work connections

Including the equipment estimates and other incidental costs (engineering, steel work, roofing), it is estimated that the total cost to the Parish is approximately \$250,000.00.

 $^{^{1}}$ Note – the \$125,000 bid proposed was not practical as it only entailed the replacement of the large external compressors and contemplated that the mechanicals and air handlers (from 1977) would continue to operate.

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
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
